Alan Freeman is a transplanted Brit and was a principal economist with the Greater London Authority from 2000 to 2011. He is now retired and lives in Winnipeg where he is co-director of the <u>Geopolitical Economy Research Group</u>.

Professor Henry Heller is a Professor of History at the University of Manitoba. He is author of the book, <u>The Capitalist University: The Transformations of Higher Education in the United</u> <u>States, 1945-2016."</u>

John Ryan is a retired Professor of Geography and Senior Scholar of Geography at the University of Winnipeg. He is also a long-time socialist.
