Gaza Strip – Events of "International conference of Palestine prisoners" started on Saturday morning in Gaza city with huge participation of mass and international delegations in order to shed light on the suffering of Palestinian prisoners in Israeli occupation jails.

In his speech, Matthias Chang, political adviser to former Malaysian Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad, asserted that he came to Gaza, carrying endorse and support of the Malaysian people.

He said during his speech: "We feel the pain towards the situation in Gaza, and when we return to Malaysia, we will convey what we saw here."

He added: "Israel should know that Malaysia stands with the Palestinian people."
