But <u>Pupul Chatterjee</u> (<u>@pupulchatterjee</u>) shares the news <u>from the Staffordshire Police</u> that 19 people have been arrested at the UAV Engines factory in Shenstone, Staffordshire, owned by Israeli arms manufacturer Elbit. (see an earlier post <u>on a sister site</u>). On the <u>Birmingham Eastside website</u> via <u>The Brummie aggregator</u>, she reports:

Chief Inspector Steve Smith, Staffordshire Police said: "In response to breaches of a High Court order and some public order offences a total of 19 persons (18 male, 1 female) were arrested. Those arrested remain in police custody and will be questioned about offences this evening."

Three other protest sites included <u>Instro Precision in Broadstair, Kent</u>; <u>Elite KL in</u> Tamworth and a site in Melbourne, Australia.

Year after year these protests are made, but the barbaric killing goes on.
