A mum has been diagnosed with a rare and aggressive cancer just 11 weeks after the birth of her baby boy.

Fi Leyshon, from Jarrow, in south Tyneside, has now been told the treatment which had kept her condition stable for the past year is no longer working.

The 30-year-old, who lives in Linthorpe, said she is determined to keep fighting for her little boy, Reuben, and has been overwhelmed and humbled by the outpouring of support since the she received the news.

She is urging others to know the symptoms of kidney cancer and visit their GPs if they are concerned something is wrong.

Ms Leyshon has now been told she has stage four incurable and inoperable metastatic renal carcinoma - with the cancer having spread to her liver and lymph nodes.

At the time of her initial diagnosis, Ms Leyshon was told chemotherapy "wouldn't touch" her kind of cancer because it is so rare and aggressive and is usually seen in older people.

May 17, 2023 - Rutledge, GA - Karen Vincent had a C-section at 26 weeks and was diagnosed with Stage 4 metastatic breast cancer that had spread to her bones, liver and brain.

First, the happy news: Doctors performed an emergency C-section when Karen's condition became unstable, and we are overjoyed to tell you that Alexander Constantine Vincent was born healthy, despite being three months premature. He'll have to stay in the NICU a few more months, which presents its own challenges, but he's healthy and growing and we're so grateful.

However, after surgery, doctors performed CT scans to find the underlying cause of Karen's condition and rapidly deteriorating health.

The scans revealed that Karen had Stage 4 metastatic breast cancer that had spread to her bones, liver, and brain. We were absolutely devastated by this news.

A Vancouver woman is trying to stay hopeful after she received heartbreaking news just two weeks ago following what she thought was just a dizzy spell due to low iron.

Aimee Cox's initial bloodwork revealed some concerns, and more tests followed in just a few days. By late November the new mother of an 11-month-old daughter says the doctor told her it was not the results they were hoping for.

The 37-year-old was diagnosed with stage 4 colon cancer. The cancer had metastasized to the liver, and a test revealed she had also tested positive for a rare protein which impacts chemotherapy response, called BRAF-V600E mutation.

Sep. 2022 – Sam Lynch had twin girls in Sep. 2022 and less than a week later she was diagnosed with Stage 4 bowel cancer. She is a fully COVID-19 vaccinated nurse.

I am writing on behalf of Kiera Adkin. I was her teacher several years ago and I feel it is important to share her journey thus far.


Kiera started feeling pain in her chest in April 2022. She assumed it was from nursing her newborn son, Xavier. However, the pain became worse, prompting her to see a doctor. After various tests, Kiera was diagnosed with stage 3 t-cell lymphoblastic lymphoma, which is one of the various types of cancer hurting, and taking away so many of our loved ones. She needed immediate surgery to remove the 5x 8 inch tumor from her chest prior to starting treatment for the cancer. Kiera started her first round of chemotherapy, which rendered her unable to solely care for her son. Kiera's mom quit her job to care for her daughter and grandson. As Kiera receives treatment, she continually experiences constant pain, severe sickness, and other adverse reactions. She also feels she is a burden to others, which has her feeling guilty, anxious and depressed. She is overwhelmed by the uncertainties of the future. Kiera is currently in her third round of intense chemotherapy. She commented how this round of treatment is so much worse than the previous two. She has treatment every other day, which leaves her physically ill, exhausted and weak. Kiera did not want anyone to know about her cancer. She felt embarrassed and did not want any attention. She did not even want to ask for help because "there are so many others in need..." After much coaxing from family and friends, she started this gofundme account/page. Her humble and kind nature had her write very little about her past and current difficulties or the uncertainties that lie ahead... This is why I had to share a little more of her experiences and struggles. She needs help. A young mom is fighting for her life after being diagnosed with an extremely rare cancer caused by pregnancy.

Darlene Lynch, 32, welcomed her first child, Cillian, last December before she was rushed to hospital 10 weeks later with severe hemorrhaging.

Doctors subsequently diagnosed Lynch with choriocarcinoma: a cancerous fast-growing tumor that develops from cells that help an embryo attach to the uterus.

Almost all choriocarcinomas — sometimes referred to as "pregnancy cancer" — form in the uterus after the fertilization of an egg by a sperm, but the cancer is so rare that it only affects one in 160,000 pregnancies and is scarcely talked about.

"I felt it was a really isolating diagnosis because I couldn't find anything about it," Lynch told Caters News Agency on Friday. "When I was in the ward, I'd speak to the nurses and they were like, 'We've not heard of it before, we've not had cases of it before,' and they'd say, 'We had to google it.' "

The cancer was so fast-growing that it had already spread to Lynch's lungs by the time she was diagnosed, meaning she was forced to immediately undergo chemotherapy.

Lynch — who resides in Melbourne, Australia — stated: "I didn't have time to think about it. I went into hospital on the Monday and by the Friday I had my diagnosis and on the Saturday I started my treatment."

SINGAPORE – In September 2021, Ms Kwa Lay Teng, then 25, was nursing her four-day-old baby girl during confinement in her mother's home when she got a call from her doctor.

"He told me: 'Hi, Lay Teng, I'm so sorry, it is breast cancer. You need to stop breastfeeding now.' I couldn't stop crying. My husband was beside me. I didn't even have to tell him what happened; he knew it was bad. He called my mum who came and took the baby away from me."

She also had to induce menopause as her hormones fuelled her cancer, a rude shock to her dreams of raising a family of five with her husband. "I was in denial… I worried if I would ever be normal again," she said.

Almost two years on, her cancer is in remission but her fear – now of relapse – remains.



At eight months pregnant, all while mothering a two-year-old, Carolina Diaz discovered a lump on her breast. The Columbian-Canadian knew immediately that there was something deeply wrong. While her gynecologist told her not to worry, that it just had to do with her breast milk, Carolina knew in her heart that this was not the case, "I kind of knew it was something bad". The lump grew after her baby was born, and Carolina was insistent that something was not right. On May 5, 2021, she received her breast cancer diagnosis.


"I couldn't believe that was happening to me," Carolina says.

Three weeks after her diagnosis, and after giving birth to her now one-yearold. Carolina went into surgery for her cancer and began an intense treatment that would take a full year to complete. In addition to the raging hormones and usual parental stress she was experiencing after giving birth to her daughter, Mila, Carolina was forced to face a devastating diagnosis at a time in her life that was meant to be happy and full of life.



Carolina's stress at this diagnosis was largely centered around her children, "I cannot die because this baby needs me to live". To add on to the stress, Carolina's family was still in Columbia. She called her cousin, who is a doctor, to break the news. Her cousin's words shifted Carolina's mindset in a way that would change her journey for the better going forward: "You have to put into your mind that you're not going to die of this".

Feb. 2021 – Glastonbury, CT – 30 year old nurse Elizabeth Emory took two Moderna COVID-19 mRNA vaccines during pregnancy (Jan. 7, 2021 and Feb. 4, 2021). On Feb.6, 2021, at 25 weeks pregnant, she was diagnosed with Starge 4 Burkitt's Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma.


