James Mackay used to be 'super-fit' taking 72-mile daily bike rides

A once super-fit personal trainer is learning to walk again after both legs and all his fingers were amputated when he suffered life-threatening sepsis. Health-conscious James MacKay, 52, had completed 72-mile bike rides and daily three-hour yoga sessions before developing a cough which wouldn't go away.

Just two hours after dialling 111 he was rushed by ambulance to hospital and shortly lapsed into a coma. He was diagnosed with a Strep A bacterial infection which triggered sepsis - a condition where the body's immune system turns on itself.

Over the next few weeks James's weight dropped from 15 stone to just a frail seven stone as the infection 'chewed through his muscles.' Surgeons were then forced to amputate both legs from below the knee and all his fingers.

Mr Mackay, 52, said: "The hospital were throwing antibiotics at me and my family were told that I was going to die anyway so they had nothing to lose in treating me." The father of two to Ellie-Mae, 22, and Joseph, 13, was in a coma for over six weeks while doctors battled to save his life in Christmas, 2022.

Mr Mackay, from Cranfield in Bedfordshire, said: "It was challenging waking up because of the pain - my thinking was all over the place, I didn't know what was real." "I was 96kg (15 stone) when I was admitted into hospital and when I came out I had dropped to 50kg (seven stone) which was almost half of my body weight.

Feb. 18, 2024 – Hertfordshire, UK – 30 year old Gina Campanini died suddenly from sepsis on Sep. 14, 2023, the day after "Sepsis Awareness Day".

- On a monday September morning, Gina woke up with what she thought was flu
- She was suffering from a tight chest, muscle pain and high temperature

'She was told it was likely just a virus,' says her sister, Maria, 26, a charity worker from London. 'Gina wasn't given any medication – she was told to go home, drink plenty of fluids and monitor her symptoms.'

Her condition deteriorated during the night, and the next morning, when she began struggling to breathe, her parents drove her to hospital.

By that stage Gina had developed sepsis, and she was admitted to intensive care. Sepsis can be triggered by common viruses such as flu, Covid or, as in Gina's case, bacterial infection group A streptococcus, also known as strep A.

She was treated with antibiotics but suffered a stroke due to the sepsis and, just over a week after entering hospital, Gina died. Her family do not blame the GP for Gina's death, but question why her health and youth, coupled with severe symptoms, did not cause more concern.

'Gina was young, fit and healthy, so the fact that she got so unwell so quickly surely should have raised alarm bells,' says Maria. 'Perhaps if Gina was advised to go to A&E sooner, or she knew the symptoms of sepsis, she might still be with us.'

Britain's worrying rise in deaths from **sepsis** may be due to some doctors not taking the condition seriously, according to the UK's top sepsis expert.

The life-threatening condition occurs when the immune system overreacts to an infection and starts to damage the body's tissues and organs, and over the past decade deaths from it have soared – from 37,000 a year in 2013 to about 48,000 a year now.

Despite repeated awareness campaigns aimed at speeding up diagnosis and treatment, sepsis now causes more deaths than breast, prostate and bowel **cancer** combined.

While the rise has been partly blamed on an ageing population and hospitals recording more sepsis cases than before, according to Dr Ron Daniels, founder and chief executive of **charity UK Sepsis Trust**, the blame can also fall on a significant number of sceptical clinicians who believe the crisis is 'all hype and hysteria'.

The problem comes as a case emerged of a 30-year-old primary school teacher who died late last year from sepsis after her infection was mistaken for a virus. Gina Campanini's family believe more could have been done to save her life.

Maria Campanini lost her sister Gina to sepsis, aged just 30, on 14th September 2023 – the day after Sepsis Awareness Day. On behalf of her whole family, Maria is sharing Gina's story and delivers three key messages about this devastating condition.



Feb. 24, 2024 – Nanaimo, BC, Canada – 23 year old Sophia, a shelter worker, was misdiagnosed with various ailments during summer of 2023, was transported to hospital on Nov. 24, 2023 with sepsis and died 3 days later on Nov. 26.

Young B.C. woman's death blamed on health-care gaps

The death of a young shelter worker in Nanaimo is being blamed on an easily treated infection that she likely contracted from clients, but that went undiagnosed because of a lack of medical care in Nanaimo.

Sophia, 23 - her family did not want her last name revealed - was a graduate of Vancouver Island University's community mental health worker program and had been working at Nanaimo Unitarian Shelter.

Her daughter started showing signs of illness in March 2023. She took a leave of absence from her job as a mental health worker at Nanaimo's Unitarian Shelter in June.

Through her care, Sophia consulted doctors at a walk-in site for young people, and tried accessing the city's lone Urgent and Primary Care Centre, since she didn't have a family physician of her own.

"The first misdiagnosis was that she had some kind of eating disorder. And you know, she knew she was trying to eat. She didn't think that was the problem," says Paul Manly, the shelter's executive director and a Nanaimo city councillor advocating on behalf of the family.

Manly and Sophia's mom say she visited Nanaimo Regional General Hospital twice. The first time, in October, she was diagnosed with hemorrhoids. The second time she was airlifted to St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver - and died two days later from sepsis on Nov. 26, 2023.

"By the time they figured out what was going on the infection had taken over her body,"

But when she fell ill last summer, losing weight and hair, she struggled to get medical care, and was then misdiagnosed with everything from an eating disorder to hemorrhoids. When she was finally properly diagnosed, it was too late.

"I truly hope changes are made so no parent/family has to live what I've been through," mother Melonie said in a social media post thanking Manly for advocating for her family.

Manly said there is one Urgent and Primary Care Care clinic to serve more than 20,000 people who don't have a family doctor in Nanaimo, and the aging Nanaimo Regional General Hospital is often overcapacity.

Sophia worked at the homeless shelter from September 2022 until last summer, when she was advised by Manly to take medical leave. The already petite woman was drained of energy and and had noticeably lost weight, he said.

She didn't have a family doctor and struggled to get a diagnosis for her rapidly declining health.

Manly said sick and weak patients attending the city's only walk-in clinic must line up at 5 or 6 a.m. in hopes of seeing a doctor when it opens at 8 a.m., which is tough on people. "I've been there and done that."

When Sophia got appointments at the Youth Wellness Centre at the Nanaimo Leisure Centre - in part to get a clinician's note for her extended heath benefits - she was wrongly diagnosed with an eating disorder, even though she strongly rejected that as the cause of her illness.

In October, Sophia's mother, who had previously lost a son to an epilepsy-related illness while living in a rural area near Prince George, took her daughter to Nanaimo Regional General Hospital's emergency department, where Sophia was diagnosed as having hemorrhoids and given a prescription.

A month later, on Nov. 16, Sophia was brought back to the hospital. This time, anemic and requiring a blood transfusion, she was admitted.

Manly said Sophia had a compromised immune system - something that could have been figured out with blood tests. "They figured it out only the second time she went to the emergency ward," he said. "She had a transfusion and they did blood work and as soon as they did that, they figured out what was going on."

On Nov. 24, according to her mother, Sophia was diagnosed with an internal infection that her immune system wasn't able to fight.

"Both of those things were completely detectable and preventable," said Manly. "Her death was preventable."

Sophia was transported to St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver but it was too late - "sepsis had taken hold and she died three days later," Manly said

Jan. 28, 2024 - Moncton, NB, Canada - 49 year old Dan Wetmore was sick for a week. By the time he went to the hospital it was too late and he died from Strep A sepsis.

Her husband, Dan Wetmore, died of strep A in Moncton, N.B., on Jan. 19 at the age of 49. He had been sick for more than a week.

"By him putting it off and putting it off and putting it off, it ended his life," said Wetmore.

Canada is seeing a record number of cases of invasive Group A strep, a bacterial infection that kills roughly one in 10 people who contract it, according to data obtained by CBC News. There were more than 4,600 cases confirmed in Canada in 2023.

Invasive Group A streptococcal disease happens when the common strep A bacteria spreads beyond the places it typically infects, such as the throat or skin, where it can cause necrotizing fasciitis, known as flesh-eating disease.



Jan. 14, 2024 – 18 year old Nat Manhertz had a strep throat but deteriorated rapidly with sepsis and had to have all her limbs amputated.

On Sunday in May 2023, Nat Manhertz <mark>started off having a fever and sore throat</mark>, so she took a sick day from school on Monday. She felt a little better and went to school on Tuesday. Almost immediately upon arriving, her symptoms intensified.

"I felt like I was about to pass out," Nat Manhertz says. "I (was) not able to try to drive home."

Her mom picked her up, and she tried napping when she got home.

"I was in constant, aching pain. Everything hurt," she recalls.

After experiencing stomach and neck pain with a headache, Nat Manhertz visited urgent care, where doctors told her she had a migraine. They prescribed medication, but it did little to ease her pain. She woke from a nap feeling extremely uncomfortable.

"She was like, 'I've never felt this pain before,'" Thelia Manhertz recalls.

Thelia Manhertz took her daughter to the emergency room, where doctors ran tests and diagnosed Nat Manhertz with strep throat. But they also learned something shocking: Nat Manhertz's organs were failing. Doctors transferred the teen to Children's Health Care of Atlanta by flight. When her mom arrived, doctors said her daughter was in serious condition and had experienced cardiac arrest.


"(They said) she's going into septic shock. I'm like, 'What is that?'" Thelia Manhertz says. "They're like, 'We have to get her onto some ... machine immediately to save her life."

As Nat Manhertz battled sepsis, the capillaries in her limbs didn't work properly, causing her tissues to die. Her skin sloughed off and smelled like fish, she says, and undergoing bandage changes felt excruciating.

"My hands were just like hard rocks. I couldn't move them," she recalls. "I came to the acceptance mentally that this is not getting any better. This is gross. Go ahead and take them off because I don't want them anymore."

After grappling with sepsis, Nat Manhertz eventually had to have all four limbs amputated. While she's "still processing" her experience, she knows the care she received saved her life.

Jan. 9, 2024 – UK – 38 year old Kirsten Martin, a bride to be, developed crippling stomach pains over Christmas and died 2 weeks later from SEPSIS on Jan. 9, 2024.



Dec. 17, 2023 – CA – Progressive Evangelical Pastor Shawn Koester died Dec. 17, 2023 from pneumonia and sepsis.



Oct. 13, 2023 – Toronto, ON – 39 year old Canadian doctor (COVID-19 Vaccinated) Dr.Adam Robert Rossi died Oct. 13, 2023. He was diagnosed with HLH, had a stroke & sepsis (I was informed by someone who knew the case).


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



Nakita Harden, 33, from Norfolk, claims her brush with death began during an innocuous game of bowling with her boyfriend when she said she scratched her thumb on the inside of a bowling ball.

The mother-of-two said she initially brushed off the scratch as a minor cut but became concerned when she noticed a pain in her thumb later that evening.

Nakita showed it to her boyfriend Jordan who said he thought he recognised the beginnings of a tell-tale sign of the condition - a tracking line on her arm.

Nakita, a sales manager said: 'I didn't think anything of it at first. You get scratches all the time.

While Nakita worried that she would no longer have a knuckle after the operation, mercifully the part of her hand that was removed with the infection did grow back, and she made a full recovery

Former pro football star Mike Williams died from a rare variety of bacterial sepsis and related complications, days after he was removed from life support after sustaining injuries from an August workplace accident, authorities confirmed Thursday.

Williams died Sept. 12 in hospice care at St. Joseph's Hospital in Tampa, around the corner from the stadium where he once dazzled crowds as a receiver for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He was 36.

His death was caused by "Bacterial Sepsis with Cerebral Abscesses and Necrotizing Lobar Pneumonia due to multiple Dental Caries and retained tooth roots," according to an initial case summary report from the

Some people are calling this "VAIDS" (Vaccine Induced AIDS), a term I'm not very fond of.


We don't know how long COVID-19 Vaccine Immune damage lasts, but it appears to be a common Long term side effect.
