Jon Trasamar, the collegiate teammate of Erik van Rooyen who inspired the South African to his recent victory at the World Wide Technology Championship, died Saturday of Stage 4 melanoma at age 33.

Trasamar's battle was thrust into the spotlight when van Rooyen broke down into tears following his win in Los Cabos, Mexico, on Nov. 5. Van Rooyen entered the week ranked No. 125 in the FedExCup Fall standings, needing to play well over the final three weeks of the season to retain his playing privileges for 2024.

Van Rooyen and his caddie Alex Gaugert, another former teammate at Minnesota, learned of Trasamar's worsening condition two days before the start of the World Wide Technology Championship. They remained in the field, battling their emotions throughout the week. Van Rooyen admitted to breaking down in his hotel room on Friday. On Saturday, he said a win would "mean everything." Then, on Sunday, he shot an incredible 8-under 28 on the back nine, including an eagle on the final hole, en route to a final-round 63 and twoshot victory.

Super Bowl champion and retired Indianapolis Colts offensive guard Matt Ulrich has died, according to the team's owner, Jim Irsay. Ulrich was 41.

"I am heartbroken to hear of the passing of Matt Ulrich," Irsay wrote on X Wednesday, alongside a photo of Ulrich holding the Vince Lombardi trophy in 2007. "Matt was with us only two seasons, but left his mark on many. Great guy, I hear he was a great dad — and he was a Super Bowl champ. My prayers to his family."

The former captain at Northwestern University played two seasons with the Colts comprising the entirety of his NFL career, but Ulrich won a title when a Peyton Manning-led Colts team defeated the Chicago Bears 29–17 in Super Bowl XLI.

Upon his retirement in 2016, Manning looked back on the moment and credited his teammates, including Ulrich.



#### San Francisco surfer, father of 2 dies after accident at Ocean Beach

Kirby Lee, a longtime San Francisco surfer and father of two, died Nov. 6 from injuries sustained during a <u>surfing accident</u> four days before, according to his family. Lee was 54.

What, exactly, happened in the water on Nov. 2 remains unknown. It was a relatively calm day for Ocean Beach; while waves there can easily reach 20 feet on the biggest days, Jose Lopez, another surfer who was present at the scene, described the waves that day as "tiny." Lee was wearing a helmet, as many surfers do at Ocean Beach, according to surfers at the scene.

ee, an experienced surfer and associate professor of clinical pharmacy at UC San

Francisco, was found unconscious in the water before noon. Another surfer brought him to shore, where a group of people administered CPR and waited for paramedics to arrive, according to Lopez. San Francisco Fire Department Capt. Justin Schorr said Lee was "pulseless and not breathing." He was rushed to UCSF Medical Center, where he was put on life support.

Lee's sister, Sabrina Umphress, told SFGATE over the phone that doctors were unable to conclusively say what led to her brother's death.

"They ruled out heart attack, they ruled out stroke, there were no injuries, nothing on the outside of this body that indicated he had been hit by his board and knocked unconscious, nothing," Umphress said. "We asked the doctors so many times. It sounded like they were very thorough. It's a mystery."

In his final days, he was surrounded by his family, friends and colleagues.

"Doctors said that there was extensive brain damage caused by lack of oxygen," his sister said. "Kirby was an organ donor. They were successfully able to transplant his heart and kidneys."

MISSOULA — Former Montana basketball star Anthony Johnson passed away Wednesday in Tacoma, Washington. He was 37.

Johnson had been in critical condition since suffering a massive stroke during his daughter's birthday party on Oct. 21, Johnson and his wife, former Lady Griz basketball player Shaunte (Nance) Johnson, have three children together and another on the way.

Shaunte Johnson wrote on Facebook Thursday, "We celebrated our last anniversary and his last breaths cuddled in his bed, blasting our favorite love songs. I am one of the luckiest women to have experience (sic) love at this level, for soooo long! Thank you all for your prayers! I know that our God is still good but I still feel so lost without my best friend, lover and teammate of 18 years!"

Johnson played for the Grizzlies during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons, leading the team in points and assists per game and earning first-team all-Big Sky Conference recognition both seasons. He was the Big Sky Conference newcomer of the year in 2008-09 when he averaged 17.6 points per game. In 2009-10, he upped his average to 19.2 points per game and was named an All-American by CollegeInsider.com.

In 2010, Johnson was the Big Sky tournament MVP and UM's top male athlete.

Johnson's 42-point game against Weber State in the 2010 Big Sky championship is the stuff of legend. With the Grizzlies trailing the Wildcats 40-20, Johnson scored 34 second-half points — including Montana's final 21 points — to help the Griz rally for a 66-65 win and

Surfer and Olympic hopeful Israel Barona has died at age 34, the Ecuadorian Olympic Committee and El Salvador's National Civil Police confirmed.

Barona, who was working towards the 2024 Paris Olympics, died in El Salvador on Tuesday while he was visiting for a competition, the Committee <u>announced</u>. El Salvador National Civil Police (PNC) <u>said</u> Barona "suffered seizures while he was in a hotel in El Zonte, La Libertad" in a statement.

The surfer was taken to a hospital when he was found, according to the PNC, "however, he was already deceased."

The PNC said they have "ruled out" homicide.

Barona began surfing when he was 10 years old and represented Ecuador in the World Surfing Games and Bolivarian Games.

His sister, <u>Dominic Barona</u>, is also a surfer. She is a 2020 Olympian and had just competed in the 2023 Pan American Games earlier this week.

Dominic, 32, posted a tribute to her brother in an Instagram story on Wednesday. "I love you cute Nanito. My love, my everything, you are my light forever," she wrote over a photo of the two smiling on a beach.


