

Turbo Cancer in Ages 18-24: College and University COVID-19 Vaccine-Mandated Students Developing Stage 4 Cancers

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Here is a report on 72 cases of TURBO CANCER in Ages 18-24 in 2023. This is just a small sample of the thousands of tragic stories that are out there:

<u>Sep. 5, 2023</u> - Woolwich, ON - 24 year old Spencer Ewen was diagnosed with very rare Desmoplastic Small Round Cell Tumor (Sarcoma).

Profile:

Spencer aged 24 and the love of his life Tina aged 21 got married on July 22 2023 after a 7 year deep relationship that led to their wonderful marriage. While they were on their honeymoon they rushed home to go to the ER due to stomach pains. The pains were thought to be maybe indigestion or perhaps just drinking a bit too much at the wedding festivities. It was less than a week later when they were given a possible Lymphoma diagnosis...but his symptoms just weren't looking like Lymphoma as only a short time passed by. The young couple met with the oncologist at Grand River Hospital to find out that Spencer has a very rare type of Cancer called Desmoplastic Small Round Cell Tumour. Because of the rarity of this type of Cancer, there are not many doctors that know about this Sarcoma so the prognosis is hard to determine there is no cure. This beautiful couple

She was a young woman on her way to a productive life and at this young age she very well should have been. Directly after graduating high school, she enlisted in the U.S. National Guard Reserve where she has now been placed on medical leave.





In May 2023 after weeks of suffering from chronic migraines, severe nausea and whole body pain she was diagnosed with Rhabdomyosarcoma. Rhabdomyosarcoma is a rare type of cancer that forms in soft tissue or sometimes hollow organs. It can occur at any age, but it mostly affects children. Soon after, she started intense chemotherapy at Ochsner Pediatric Cancer Center of New Orleans, Louisiana. After rounds and weeks of treatment,

Hello,

I'm a 22-year-old who was on the cusp of an exciting new chapter before life took an unexpected turn. This summer was meant to be the culmination of my master's degree journey, and I had exciting plans to move to New Zealand in September 2023 to embark on a new adventure. A job at a geotechnical engineering firm awaited me, promising a future full of possibilities.

Then came August, a month that changed everything. I was confronted with a diagnosis that none of us ever anticipates – malignant melanoma (skin cancer). Immediate surgery was required, leading to two wide excision surgeries on my back and a sentinel lymph node biopsy, during which two of my lymph nodes were removed. The results were not what I had hoped for – one of those lymph nodes tested positive for melanoma, indicating that the cancer had already begun to spread.

At the moment, I'm facing the challenges of Stage 3B skin cancer, a reality that has put a pause on life. Instead of gearing up for exciting endeavors, I find myself navigating the complexities of treatments, uncertainty, and medical bills.

Aug. 29, 2023 – 20 year old UK University student DylanLamb has died. Dylan was told he was in remission from leukemia on July 5, 2022. He had a stem cell transplant Sep. 22, 2022. But his leukemia returned and he was told he had weeks to live.

A student has been told he has weeks to live after going to A&E suffering lower back pain.

Dylan Lamb, 20, first noticed the problems in April last year but thought he had just pulled a muscle.

After getting pain killers from his **GP**, he went to **A&E** with his mum, Kim, at the end of the month after the pain became "unbearable".

Days later, he was having chemotherapy after being diagnosed with Precursor T-Cell Acute Lymphoblastic **Leukaemia**.

Dylan's girlfriend, Phoebe Cole, said: "He had this lower back pain that could have been multiple different things, he thought he had pulled a muscle. We were coming home for Easter and it got progressively worse, he lost his appetite and was being sick.

ollowing a change in chemotherapy. Dylan was told he was in remission on July 5, 2022. A onor was found and Dylan underwent a stem cell transplant on September 22 and 23 efore being discharged on October 6.

on after, Dylan began feeling "normal again" and returned to university. But in June this ar he started to feel the pain in his lower back once again.

Literally two weeks ago the lower back pain came back and he said he knows this pain and : felt familiar," Phoebe explained.

"He went back to his doctors at Nottingham City Hospital and asked them to check him over.

"A blood test showed nothing and he went home. He admitted himself into hospital as he wanted an MRI, it showed nothing, and he had another blood test on June 29 which showed his blood cells were inclined.

"He was told the Leukaemia has come back and he has weeks or months left to live. It was a massive shock to the system, especially as we had been told he was fine, not fine and fine again.

"His family are amazing and are supporting him. He is keeping his sense of humour and is being really up beat, but I know deep down he must be scared."

Dylan's only option for life-saving treatment is a clinical trial in America which would involve CAR T Therapy and Base Editing where the DNA of T cells are taken from the donor and reensineered so they attack only the Leukaemia and not each other.

<u>Aug. 28, 2023</u> – Meadowbrook, AL – 23 year old Lauren Beck graduated University of Alabama at Birmingham and was diagnosed with AML leukemia and now needs an urgent bone marrow transplant.

Hi, my name is Dr. Samantha Shebib and I'm a professor in communication at The University of Alabama at Birmingham. Lauren was a previous student of mine, where she took 3 classes of mine within the first 2 years of my employment at UAB. Lauren graduated in the Spring semester of 2023. On August 27th, 2023, Lauren was experiencing some symptoms and went to emergency room in Tuscaloosa, Alabama (where her family resides). By Monday, August 28th she was transferred to UAB hospital. After having a bone marrow biopsy, Lauren was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia. She has started 24/7 chemotherapy treatment to see how aggressive the blood cancer is.

Aug. 27, 2023 - Chicago, IL - 19 year old Tyler Fenlon was diagnosed with a very rare Stage 4 Primary Bone DLBCL (with spleen and bone marrow involvement, lytic lesions, extension of soft tissue into spinal canal, etc).

A cancer diagnosis is a life-altering event for anyone, especially for a young adult who is just starting to reinvent himself.

Hello, my name is Vince, and I am creating this fundraiser for my friend Veronique and her son Tyler who was recently diagnosed with stage 4 cancer. Tyler is 19 years old, and he graduated high school in 2022. In September, he moved to Connecticut to continue his



After a week of daily blood work, MRI and CAT scans, biopsies, and waiting.

Tyler was transferred to *Smilow Cancer Hospital at Yale New Haven*. Where the bone marrow, bone biopsy, and PET scan results were returned, he was diagnosed with **Stage 4 Primary Bone DLBCL with spleen and bone marrow involvement** (diffuse bone metastasis, lytic lesions, an extension of hypermetabolic soft tissue into spinal canal C7-C3). The treatment plan is called DA-EPOCH + Rituximab (R-EPOCH). It's 6 to 8, 21-day cycles. Rituximab to start the cycle, then the next four days (96 hours) continuous infusion of Doxorubicin, Etoposide, and Vincristine on the 5th day Cyclophosphamide for 2 hours, and a shot of Neulasta to boost WBC. Then rest and recover. Tyler will check in twice weekly for blood work until the next cycle starts.




On May 17th, Jada got some really tough news - she found out she had a brain tumor. Just two weeks before that, she started having really bad headaches and couldn't keep any food down. She went to the emergency room, but they thought it was just a bad case of the flu. Even though she kept feeling awful, the doctors initially thought it wasn't anything serious. But when her symptoms didn't get better, she went back to the ER.

On June 8, 2023, she had the surgery, and just a week later, she got more tough news - the tumor was a type called glioblastoma. It's a really serious kind of brain cancer. While Jada was trying to get back to her normal routine of walking and enjoying life, those nasty headaches came back. While she was waiting for a chance to be part of a clinical trial at Duke, which is one of the best hospitals for treating brain cancer, she got even more devastating news - the tumor was starting to grow back.

And then, on August 24th, Jada had to go through another surgery. Right now, she's in the ICU, fighting hard. Let me tell you, Jada is one of the strongest young ladies I've ever known. She's not giving up, and her whole family is right there with her, supporting her every step of the way. That's where you come in.

<u>Aug. 22, 2023</u> – Melville, NY – 19 year old Kenneth Reidenbach, a 2023 high school graduate with plans to go to College was diagnosed with a large brain cancer (he needed two urgent surgeries lasting more than 6 hours each).



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



Aidan's cancer story:

It came out of nowhere, or so it seemed. The few symptoms he had up until this point were so minute that they raised no major red flags. Nothing that would prepare us for... this. It was three short weeks ago, June 24th to be exact, when I accompanied Aidan to the ER for what we thought was a kidney infection, or stones, or something to that effect. The world basically stopped moving when those CT results came back conclusive and we heard that dreaded word "cancer". They found a very large mass over Aidan's right kidney. It shocked the ER doctors, and us of course, that Aidan was in so little pain at that point and had so few symptoms. The hospital then referred us to Urology. From there we learned the cancer had spread to his IVC vein and surrounding lymph node. At the same time, Aidan's pain started setting in so the doctor ordered a bone scan. That's when things started taking a turn for the worse and became really scary. They found cancer in all of his bones... unbelievably meaning Aidan is in stage 4. It's been an absolute whirlwind ever since. All the symptoms are now hitting him at once. He's been in extreme pain, experiencing nausea and some vomiting, has little appetite and was losing weight rather rapidly. Just a really sick guy overall recently. He's currently inpatient at Children's hospital as they run a battery of tests and scans and try to get his pain down to a manageable level. It's been a really rough few weeks for Aidan and his family; however, we all remain optimistic and positive that Aidan can and will beat this. We do know we have a long, hard road ahead of us, but Aidan is who I call my "overcomer". This kid has been through so much in his 19 years and has used every obstacle and every setback along the way to only better himself. Aidan's birth mom wasn't in the picture much when he was younger due to drug abuse and now sadly, has passed away in 2017. His father has been rather absent and negligent himself the past several years also due to drug abuse. Despite having to grow up fast and with little guidance from his birth parents, Aidan has grown into the most amazing young man. He has this huge heart and is always quick to help those in need around him. He's a gifted student, making honor roll in high school and now excelling in college his first year at Mount Saint Joseph University, despite having to work 30 hours a week at the same time to support himself fully. He's responsible and independent, signing his first lease a few weeks ago with a buddy of his to get their first apartment. He was in his element and absolutely thriving.

July 8, 2023 - England - 21 year old Sophie White was diagnosed with brain cancer Glioblastoma and has been given 1 year to live.

My name is Chloè and I'm looking to fundraise for my 21 year old best-friend Sophie and her 14 month old little boy Remi.

On the 8th of June 2023, Sophie had a seizure which no longer than 24 hours later was confirmed to be a cancerous brain tumor. On the 23rd of June she had major brain surgery removing 95% of her tumor. Sophie has almost fully recovered, only to be told that she has a grade 4 glioblastoma and a one year life expectancy. Sophie will have intensive treatment which will hopefully shrink the remaining 5%. This type of cancer is not curable, but is treatable which could help prolong her life.

July 7, 2023 - Manassas, VA - 24 year old Christian battled a late stage germ cell cancer (testicular cancer) that invaded his organs within weeks, leading to his death.



On September 15, 2022, he was diagnosed with cancer, stage III classical Hodgkin lymphoma. Throughout these six months we have put our lives on pause, including education, to complete 12 sessions of chemotherapy. Unfortunately, the positron emission tomography (PET) scan he had at the end of that treatment showed that new cancerous tumors were created in the treatment process. This makes his case much more complicated and his new diagnosis is primary refractory Hodgkin lymphoma.



Help Support Ciara In Her Fight Against Cancer



On June 16th, 2023, 20 year old, Ciara Tomlinson's life would be changed forever. Ciara is a rising junior at Florida State University. She has been on the Deans list since attendance of college and a sister of Pi Beta Phi.

Ciara Tomlinson had been a perfectly healthy and joyous child growing up, until the end of 2022. She first started experiencing dizzy spells, followed by constant nausea, throwing up bile every morning, double-vision, slurred speech, and recently, partial facial paralysis and weakness of voice. We sought help from doctors for 7 months. We pleaded for tests to be ran and scans be done. Bloodwork was conducted on multiple occasions and a ct scan was performed during Ciara's spring break. All in which was found to be cleared and normal. She was thought to have vertigo to which an ENT specialist said what she has is not vertigo. Thereafter, doctors diagnosed Ciara with anxiety and depression as everything else was normal. Months went by and the symptoms did not improve. Ciara finally started having partial facial paralysis. Upon further advocation and pushing for answers we demanded a MRI be performed.

June 16th Ciara received a call from her physician that every parent dreads. She needed to be driven to the emergency room immediately as a tumor was found in her scans the day prior. After further investigation from neurosurgeons at Sarasota Memorial Hospital and Shands Hospital in Gainesville, it had been confirmed that Ciara has been living with a 3.5 cm tumor growing in the middle of her brain stem in the 4th ventricle. Due to the location of the tumor, doctors ruled the situation to be inoperable. The exact type of treatment cannot be planned as the type of tumor was not discernible unless a brain biopsy is performed. A brain biopsy was then performed and the pathology report noted that the tumor is Diffuse intrinsic pontine gliomas (DIPGs). The result was a devastating result as the prognosis is a 6-9 month life span. Radiation has been the proposed solution. 6-8 weeks of radiation, Monday through Friday. Another option is to participate

Dear Reader, I'm Leslie Ibáñez and this fundraiser is to support who I refer to as my sweet baby brother. Bryan Ibáñez is the goofball of our family and has always been a positive light for himself and others. His loving soul and genuine spirit is one my entire family cherishes.

Bryan spent his high school years working at a local nursing home as a dedicated CNA. This time spent giving to others in a healthcare atmosphere sparked his interest and desire to become a nurse. In 2020, after graduating high school, Bryan enrolled in Missouri State University to pursue his nursing degree. Shortly after starting his college career, Bryan begun experiencing discomfort in everyday tasks. Having a busy and active lifestyle of a college freshman, Bryan thought he could work through his pain and assumed it was nothing serious.

Unfortunately, Bryans pain did not cease and escalated to a point where he finally chose to visit a doctor. Upon discovery of a tumor, Bryan was diagnosed with Stage II Testicular Cancer on September 2nd, 2022 at only 20 years old. With a Stage II Diagnosis, Bryans tumor had been manifesting for what doctors predicated well over a year. In attempt to avoid metastasis, immediate surgery called a radical orchiectomy was required and conducted shortly after diagnosis. Following surgery and testing, Lymphovascular Invasion (LVI) was still present in his body. Although removal surgery was completed, Bryan's cancer cells were still present in his tests leaving his body susceptible to a potential reoccurrence. However, with a treatment plan set into place Bryan & his doctors were left confident for an encouraging recovery even with the LVI still apparent in his blood stream.

Bryan's initial surgery was not fully covered by insurance, and he was forced to pay over 8k in medical bills out of pocket. As a college student living on server's wages, paying his own bills and supporting himself, he was forced to abandon school to make ends meet. Bryan is still trying to pay off those bills to this day.

Following his strict treatment plan, Bryan visited the doctor as needed and within the parameters of his abilities. Blood tests over the next few months resulted in promising outcomes, but unfortunately his 1st biannual CT scan did not reflect such positivity.

On May 1st, 2023, CT Scan results concluded that Bryan's cancer had metastasized.

Alarmingly—not one, but two tumors had developed; this time in his lungs. His doctors recommended immediate chemotherapy treatment. Bryan's chemotherapy treatment has


