Moazzam Begg was refused access to a London Toronto Air Canada flight following a request by Canada's High Commission in London to Air Canada: so much for freedom of expression. Begg was travelling on a British passport.

As a former cell-mate of Omar Khadr, Begg was featured in the recent film *You don't like the truth: 4 days inside Guantanamo*.
