In a statement to al-Aalam TV channel, Mansour added that this criminal acts aims at undermining the Lebanese – Iranian fraternity relations.

Minister Mansour hailed martyr Khoshnevis' contribution to the reconstruction of what has been destroyed in the Israeli aggression on Lebanon in 2006.

He offered condolences to the martyr's family and to the Islamic Republic of Iran.
